That You are truly the Radiance of the Father!

Troparion

You were Transfigured on the Mount, O Christ God, Revealing Your glory to Your disciples as far as they could bear it.

Let Your everlasting Light shine upon us sinners! Through the <u>prayers</u> of the <u>Theotokos</u>, O Giver of Light, glory to You!

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Read the Account of the Transfiguration of Our Lord

The Feast of the Transfiguration of Our Lord is celebrated every year on August 6th. The feast celebrates when Jesus was transfigured on Mount Tabor. The event is recorded in three of the Gospels, Mathew 17:1-9, Mark 9:2-8 and Luke 9:28-36.

One day Jesus took three of his disciple, Peter, James, and John up a mountain. The name of the mountain was Mount Tabor. While they were there, Jesus was transfigured. His face shone like the sun and his clothes became as white as light.

Suddenly Moses and Elijah appeared with Jesus and were talking to Him. The three disciples were in awe! Then Peter said how good it was for them to be there and he asked Jesus if he could build three booths (tents) for Moses, Elijah and Jesus.

While Peter was still speaking a cloud appeared and a voice from the cloud said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to Him." When the disciples heard this they fell face down on the ground and were terrified. Jesus came to them and told them not to be afraid. When they looked up they only saw Jesus.

As they walked down the mountain together Jesus instructed them not to tell anyone what they had seen and heard until after He had risen from the dead.

Read about the Icon of the Transfiguration of Our Lord

Central Figure – Jesus

In the very center of the icon we see Jesus. His right hand is lifted up as the sign of blessing. His left hand is holding a scroll, this shows that He is the Word of God in the flesh. The circle of light around Him (mandorla) represents His divine glory and transforming light. The halo around His head has three letters on it, which mean 'I Am.' This represents the name of God that was revealed to Moses in Exodus 3:14, which showed that Jesus is the divine Son of God.

Prophet Elijah and Moses

On the two mountain peaks on each side of Jesus are Moses and Prophet Elijah. The mountain peak that Moses is standing on symbolizes the time when Moses encountered God on Mount Sinai. And the mountain peak that Prophet Elijah is standing on symbolizes when Elijah met God on Mount Horeb. Now they are meeting Jesus once again on another mountain, Mount Tabor.

In the icon Moses is holding the stone tablets with the Ten Commandments, this represents the Law. Prophet Elijah represents the prophets. Both Moses and Prophet Elijah are bowing down to Christ, this shows that Jesus is the fulfillment of both the Law and the Prophets, He is the complete revelation of God.

Moses and Prophet Elijah also represent the living and the departed. This is because Prophet Elijah was taken to heaven in a chariot of fire (living). Moses represents the departed since he died a natural death (dead).

Three Disciples

Below Jesus we see the three disciples, Peter, James and John. The icon shows their response to seeing Jesus transfigured. John is in the center and has fallen prostrate, James has fallen over and has his hands over his eyes, while Peter has his hand raised which shows his desire to build three tents (booths). The clothes of the disciples are in a mess (disorder), this shows how shocked and overwhelmed they were by what they had seen.

This feast reminds of a few very important things

1. It reminds us of who Jesus really is.

On the outside He looks like a normal human being, just like us. But by allowing Himself to be 'transfigured' – He showed us who He was. He is God! He is the True Light which gives light to every man (John 1:9); and we see that blinding heavenly Light during the Transfiguration.

2. We are reminded of why Jesus' came to earth

God's ultimate purpose in sending Jesus was to help us be transformed – to become like Jesus. But we human beings, cannot do this ourselves. When we believe who Jesus really is, we can be transformed from the inside out, by the power (energy) of God; similar to the transformation we see in the event of the Transfiguration.

How is This Possible?

The most important question is, how can I allow God to transform me? No, it will not automatically happen! But thankfully, the church has given us certain ways to help God transform us - taking part in the Sacraments (Baptism, Confession, Holy Eucharist, etc.) and some spiritual practices like - Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving.

How Do They Help To Transform Us?

Prayer: When we pray, as we ought to, we pray for God's desires, rather than ours, to be fulfilled in our lives. Ex: the Jesus Prayer and the Lord's Prayer.

Fasting: We give up food (or delicacies) and have plain simple food. Fasting is returning to simplicity. This is a way to tell ourselves that our souls are more important than our bodies. This also helps us to overcome many temptations in our lives and transform us.


<u>Almsgiving:</u> In general, we always want to keep things for ourselves. That greed corrupts our soul. But, when we give things away – may it be money, clothes, food, time or other things which are valuable for us, to someone who is lesser privileged than us, it is changing us.

When we faithfully follow the practices which the church has given us, we will slowly be transformed by the power of God, from the inside out.


As we celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration, let us continue to pray that our lives will be changed to reflect the glory of God!.
