My beloved in Christ,

As nature has seasons, so does the Church. Our spiritual year, marked by fasts, feasts, and disciplines like prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, is designed to strengthen us into Christlikeness. As we read in Genesis 8:22: "While the earth remains, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, winter and summer, and day and night shall not cease." These seasons and practices are not burdens but blessings, helping us grow stronger and deeper in our faith and witness.

November marks the beginning of a new liturgical year, ushering in the holy seasons of Annunciation and Advent. This is an ideal time to reflect on the past year and set new spiritual commitments. Our resolutions, unlike worldly ones, are rooted in God's grace and strength, not human willpower alone. Together, let's journey through the seasons, celebrating feasts with joy and observing fasts in humility and repentance, growing together as one body in Christ.

I join St. Paul in praying that you "...grasp how wide, long, high, and deep is the love of Christ... that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God" (Ephesians 3:17-19). May the immeasurable power of the Triune God that work in us, bring forth glory and honour in the Church and in the world through the intercessions of all the saints and the Holy Theotokos in and through our lives, now forever and ever.
